Hunter Tool

Circular carbide cutting tip

Does not require sharpening (replace tip when dull)

available in 3/8", 1/2", 5/8" + several swan-neck versions available

HSS ring tool

Can be sharpened with tool provided (replacements available)

available in 3/8", 1/2", 5/8" + various boring bars

Munro Hollower

HSS or Tungsten Carbide on swiveling tip

Can be sharpened

available in a variety of sizes and configurations

Kelton Hollowers

Tip material not published

Require sharpening

available in 5/16", 1/2", 5/8" and 3/4" sets of 3 differing curves or seperately
can be paired with Kelton captured hollowing system

Can be sharpened (replacements available)
